Stand in the Bell tower of the Town Hall when the bell strikes (Part of the Town Hall Tour).

Stand over the well in the Sun pub

Dungeon

Be locked p in the Castle Dungeon's (Part of the Castle Tour).

View the sunset over the Lake District from Morecambe promenade whilst eating fish and chips..

Lune Bore

Off Church street. Multi screen cinema showing recent releases and blockbusters. Normal price £4.99

The Dukes

Moor Lane. LA1 1QE9. Behind St Nickolas Arcade. Independent cinema showing short run films and plays. Home of the summer theatre in the Park (usually August) Student discount

The Grand

St Leonardgate, LA1. Opened in 1782 with period decoration. plays, comedy, drama, music.

COFFEE SHOPS AND CAFES

Lancaster is full of coffee shops including the usual big brands Café Nero, Costa and Starbucks (relaxing upstairs lounge and free WiFi.) Its worth exploring the local ones which have lots of character but which often close mid afternoon.

Don't miss Atkinsons coffee shops, The Music Room (lovely to sit outside) and The Hall for some of the best coffee in Lancaster. The Herbarium offers an excellent vegan alternative whilst Print Room is situated in a lively arts centre. There are loads to check out!

Lancaster is rich in Georgian architecture built on the wealth from the slave trade. At one time the port of Lancaster was larger than Liverpool!

The Sun Pub

Church St, LA1 1ET, Stand over a well in one of the rooms.

The Town Hall

Dalton Square Guided tours during the summer. Another must. Worth the small fee

Atkinson's

12 China St, LA1 1EX. Tea and coffee merchants since 1837.Period shop and exotic aroma

The Museum

Originally the council chamber now a local museum. Market square

The Priory Church

Bedside the Castle. Originally founded by the Saxons now mostly ornate 17th century Great views and remains of Roman baths to the rear (if you can find them!)

Informal friendly walking tours of the centre of Lancaster run by Hope Church. Look out for details on fb.com/hopelancaster

WEATHER

Autumn Days shorten. Often cold and wet

Winter Short daylight hours. You need warm clothes

Spring The days lengthen. The weathers is very variable

Summer Long days. Warm and occasionally hot

R4TW

Annually in May. "Run for the World" Morecambe. Buses 1, 6. Sponsored 5 or 10km run along the seafront

Kite festival

Annually in June . Morecambe. Buses 1, 6, 100. Watch massive kites fly over the beach to the sound of a brass band

Jazz Festival

Annually in September. Town centre. Like the music festival, but Jazz

Music Festival

Annually in October. Town centre. Listen for free in over 30 venues. Whatever your taste there will be something for you. Make a day of it sampling all the local and regional bands

Heritage Week

Annually in September. Town centre. Free access to many historic buildings in Lancaster and Morecombe. Plan your visits to get the best out of it

Light Up Lancaster

An arts festival celebrating bonfire night at the start of November with events across the city, culminating in the fireworks display at Lancaster Castle

Highest Point

Lancasters biggest music festival, every May in Williamsons Park attracting bigger bands and bigger crowds.

In the Castle seen from Williamson Park (near 5 November).

River Lune

Walk over the railway (Carlisle) bridge at night from St George's Quay. It could "almost" be Venice! (Go in a group, for security)

Bell tower

Stand in the Bell tower of the Town Hall when the bell strikes (Part of the Town Hall Tour).

Well

Stand over the well in the Sun pub

Dungeon

Be locked p in the Castle Dungeon's (Part of the Castle Tour).

Sunset

View the sunset over the Lake District from Morecambe promenade whilst eating fish and chips..

View

From the Town Hall bell tower, or the gallery at Ashton Memorial , Williamson park (occasionally open).

Lune Bore

A meter high, small, rolling wave from the mouth of the Lune to e Snatchems, (three miles) at Spring tides from the cycle path to Glasson Dock. (There are only 60 bores worldwide).

Cycle along the disused railway line at high tide, lunch at Glasson Dock, eat ice cream beside the dock and then return.

The Canal

Walk north over the rather splendid aqueduct (built 1797) or south into the countryside. Look out for swans and their signets!

Williamson Park

A rather splendid, many facetted Park on the side of a hill capped by the Ashton memorial which is visible from most parts of town.

Heysham village

Bus 4. Explore the Abbey ruins and church, walk from the quaint village along the prom beside the sea, until you get tired then catch a bus back.

From the bus station into the heart of the Lake District (Grasmere). Group discounts for 3 and 5 people.
